What is this product?

Type

This product is an investment fund.

Term

The Fund is established for an unlimited duration, with the possibility for the Board of Directors to decide the termination of the Fund at its sole discretion.

Objectives

The Fund seeks to increase the value of its assets over the long term by investing predominantly in transferable equity securities such as equities, other equity shares such as co-operative shares and participation certificates issued by, or warrants on transferable equity securities of companies which are domiciled worldwide and which are active throughout the environmental value chain.

Selection of investments will rely on a combination of financial criteria, as well as Environmental, Social & Governance criteria. The Fund promotes environmental and social characteristics and qualifies as an investment product in accordance with article 8(1) of Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 on sustainability related disclosures in the financial services sector. In that respect, the Fund applies a sustainable strategy which aims to achieve a positive environmental impact by investing mainly in companies with a low environmental footprint that contribute to solving global environmental challenges by providing products & services in the environmental value chain.

The investment process integrates ESG factors based on the proprietary and third-party research of the investment manager (including data from Sustainalytics and ISS, and in-house CFRA accounting and management quality).

The selection process includes the following steps:

- Exclusion filters: that exclude (i) companies and activities that are deemed to have a negative impact, on the basis of norm-based, sectoral exclusions and planetary boundaries induceicatorsd, (ii) companies that might have a negative impact on the environment and the society and (iii) companies involved in serious human rights and environmental damages and do not respect the planet boundaries. As part of the Fund manager Sustainable Investment Policy, the Fund complies with the sets of exclusions applying to article 8 investment product as described in the Book 1 and with the additional exclusions applied by the investment manager. The Fund will not invest in companies that have a strategic involvement in alcohol production.
- ESG integration; by integrating the ESG sustainalytics risk ratings, controversies and ISS Governance rating in the overall investment process in the company scores. This score determines the weights

of stocks in the portfolio. This weight is upward or downward due according to the sustainability risk considerations.

Both approaches described above are completed by a positive thematic screening: the Fund invests into companies that might have a positive impact, mainly in companies whose at least 20% of their activities (as measured by turnover, enterprise value, earning before income and tax, or similar metrics) are related to, for example but not limited to, energy efficiency, renewable energy, pollution control, water supply & technology, waste management & recycling, sustainable agriculture & forestry or dematerialized economy.

For assessing the good governance, the Social and Governance considerations are integrated in the scoring process. Companies scores are based on criteria such as business franchise, management quality, and financial attractiveness. In addition to scores from external parties, the Investment manager integrate its own evaluation into the score.

At least 90% of the sub-und should be covered by the sustainability researchand at least, the bottom 20% of issuers with lowest ESG characteristics are excluded.

Methodological limitations can be assessed in terms of: nature of ESG information (quantification of qualitative data), ESG coverage (some data are not available for certain issuers) and homogeneity of ESG data (methodological differences).

The minimum asset allocation in such securities on a consolidated basis (direct and indirect investments) will be of 60% of the Fund's net assets (after deduction of the Fund's cash). Moreover, the minimum ownership in equity securities will be of 75% of the Fund's net assets.

Investments in debt securities do not exceed 10% of its net assets.

The Fund may invest for maximum 10% of its net assets in funds that have been selected in accordance with a number of qualitative and quantitative criteria.

This Fund is actively managed and is compared to the MSCI World TR Net Index for performance and risk level indicator purposes. However, the reference to this index does not constitute any objective or limitation in the management and composition of the portfolio and the Fund does not restrain its universe to the index components. The index does not evaluate or include its constituents on the basis of environmental and/or social characteristics and is therefore not aligned with the ESG characteristics promoted by the Fund.

Therefore returns may deviate materially from the performance of the reference index.

The base currency of the Fund is EUR.

The unit is a distribution unit. Dividends will be paid annually.

Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Netherlands bank business days).

Intended retail investor

This product is intended for investors who plan to stay invested for at least 5 years and are prepared to take on a medium level of risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return. It is designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

What are the risks and what could I get in return? Risks

What happens if ABN AMRO FGR ABN AMRO Pictet Global Environmental Equities is unable to pay
